CONVERSATION GUIDE

This week's message was about realizing that God draws near to us out of compassion, not because of our behavior. Below are some questions that will help guide the discussion.

Matthew 3:1-6

In those days John the Baptist came, preaching in the wilderness of Judea and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." This is he who was spoken of through the prophet Isaiah:

"A voice of one calling in the wilderness,

'Prepare the way for the Lord,

make straight paths for him."

John's clothes were made of camel's hair, and he had a leather belt around his waist. His food was locusts and wild honey. People went out to him from Jerusalem and all Judea and the whole region of the Jordan. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River.

grown much too familiar with. However, many people have come to an understanding of repentance that doesn't quite get at the biblical idea. Many people think that the biblical idea of repentance is to change one's behavior in order to draw near to God. Ryan talked about how this idea paints our relationship with God as transactional. A transactional relationship with God is effective in modifying people's behavior, but it isn't actually helpful in becoming more connected to God. In the bible, repentance is a word that means "to change one's mind after being with." When John the Baptist calls people to repent, he does so because "the Kingdom of God has drawn near," not in order to make the Kingdom of God draw near. Paul says in Romans 2:4 that God's kindness leads us to repentance, not God's wrath.

How have you experienced repentance in the past?

Discuss the similarities and differences between your past understanding of repentance and the understanding presented in Ryan's message.
